Amy, from Little Earnock, took first place in the Miss UK heat of the World Supermodel pageant.

She battled it out against 40 other girls to take the title in Cheshire on September 12.

Amy was shocked to win as the pageant was only the second she had taken part in.

The first was Miss Earth earlier this year , which Amy took third place in.

Amy, who studies media and works with Clyde 1, said: "This pageant felt completely out of my depth – a lot of experienced girls were in it who had won big international titles already.

"We spent two whole days in a hotel in Cheshire rehearsing for this pageant which was being held on the Friday night with photo shoots, video recordings, fitness sessions, catwalk lessons and beauty queen 'dos and dongs'.

"It was a lot to take in and I thought I had no chance at all so I didn't even wish to win because I knew I would just be disappointed.

"There was an opening round, swimsuit round, creative wear round, interview and evening wear round.

"It became results time and I managed to win the Miss Congeniality Award, meaning the friendliest girl, voted for by the other contestants. I was shocked and flattered.

"My name was called again for Best Interview Award and I was ecstatic – for a girl studying media and journalism that's quite an achievement.

"Best evening wear –my name was called again and I couldn't believe it.

" Three awards out of 10 when there were so many girls there.

"They then announced the winner and I was so shocked and amazed to realise I had won the title of World Supermodel UK which means I am representing the UK in the world finals over in Fiji.

"It still hasn't sunk in yet and I don't think it will for quite some time."
